

ON THE SOUTH DEVON RAILWAY





can be seen. However, the short section between the tunnel mouths and the new building remains in the open air in the cutting.



SLAB TRACK REPLACEMENT BETWEEN WEST BROMPTON AND EARL'S COURT







Above: During the weekend of 30/31 March 2019, 60 metres of ballast slab track conversion was achieved between West Brompton and Earl's Court on the eastbound. The brown field site where Earl's Court Exhibition Centre once stood was utilised to drill 400mm service holes into the track. These holes enabled suction excavation vehicles to be used that could constantly recycle within 15 minutes. The slab track will reduce rail noise, with the possibility of homes being built over the tunnel.
