

MAJOR PROJECTS RESTART

Work is to restart work on major infrastructure projects in June, including the upgrade at Bank station and the Northern Line Extension to Battersea. TfL applied a "safe stop" to its major project activities at over 300 construction projects in March following coronavirus lockdown, which resulted in a major downturn in TfL revenues.

Despite work restarting on most projects, TfL has announced a £525M decrease in its capital spending programme for 2020/21, in an Emergency Budget proposal released ahead of the board meeting in early (TfL agreed a 1.6bn funding package with government on 19 May 2020). Under the revised budget, annual spending on new capital investments will be reduced from £1.3bn to £808M. Spending on Update Boards (ESUBs) seen at Canary Wharf its renewals programme has also been reduced by Just how accurate the £201M, down from £531M to £330M.

Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan lines) and the Barking Riverside extension project. Station enhancement projects at Knightsbridge, Paddington and Tottenham Hale also remain under the Emergency Budget proposal.

CROSSRAIL



Crossrail work resumed in early-June. Seen in Old Oak Common Depot sidings are a mix of sevenand nine-car trains of Class 345 Stock. The operation of Class 345 trains to Heathrow, which was approved on 13 May 2020, is still awaited to replace the Class 360s. While Terminal 4 is closed present. they operate to and from T5.
